Our mission is to help children and families to realize the possibilities of their lives through foster care, adoption and mental health services.

- Thanks to supporters and partners like you, 2,134 children and families in 14 Northeast Ohio counties healed from trauma, found stability, and realized the possibilities of their lives.
- 136 children found safety, care, and belonging in Pathway foster homes
- 25 children were adopted by Pathway foster homes and now have forever families! One adoptive father shared, "This is one of the greatest things we have ever been a part of."
- 60 young adults in the Bridges Program received coaching, housing support, and life-skills training so they could step confidently into independence after foster care.
- **487 children** (ages birth–6) in **24 classrooms** were supported by Early Childhood Mental Health specialists, helping little ones regulate emotions, connect with peers, and thrive during critical developmental years.
- 75 volunteers gave 685 hours of time—planning events, serving on the board, assisting with projects, and reminding children that they are valued and loved.
- 37 teens experienced healing and connection at TRUST Camp in July, a safe space where youth discover friendship, confidence, and self-worth. A teen said: "This is my third and last year at camp, and I really enjoy showing the new campers what we are going to do. I will miss it next year."
- 27,811 mental health services were provided to children and families including counseling, group support, Family Empowerment, and case management resources.
- 230 children and teens participated in prevention programs which reduces risk of needing mental health services and promotes resilience through support from trusted adults.
