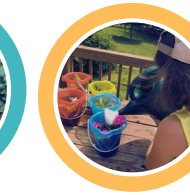


You Can Leave a Meaningful Legacy through **PLANNED GIVING**

When you include Pathway Caring for Children in your estate plan, you will help vulnerable children become resilient for generations to come.

Thank you for being the kind of person who cares deeply for children who have been abused and neglected. Donors like you make it possible to continue providing foster care, adoption, and mental health services for children and families who need it the most.

What is legacy or planned giving? It's possible for anyone with assets. You decide how your long-term vision will make the greatest impact with your planned giving and take advantage of significant tax benefits. Here are some options:

- **BEQUESTS (gifts in your will or trust)** – Simply designate Pathway Caring for Children in your bequest to give a specific dollar amount or a percentage of your estate. This will not affect your cashflow during your lifetime and is easy to revoke if your situation changes.
- **IRA CHARITABLE ROLLOVER** – If you are 70½ or older, you can transfer up to \$100,000 each year directly from your IRA to Pathway Caring for Children and not recognize it as income. A qualified spouse may also contribute up to \$100,000. It also counts toward your minimum required distribution from the IRA for the year.
- **LIFE INSURANCE** – Gift your policy outright or name Pathway Caring for Children as your beneficiary. You can also take out a new policy and irrevocably name Pathway as the owner and beneficiary of the insurance contract.

Leaving your legacy at Pathway Caring for Children is simple – talk to your financial advisor or legal counsel. Thank you for doing your part in changing the lives of children for years to come.
